(1) to divert that length of footpath No. BZ55 in the Parish of Bosbury commencing at a point on the Class II Bosbury to Stony Cross Road, B4220, a distance of approximately 310 metres (340 yards) north-east of Nashend farm and proceeding in a north-easterly direction for approximately 38 metres (42 yards) to a point approximately 94 metres (103 yards) east-north-east of 2 Pow Green, to a line commencing at a further point on the Class II Bosbury to Stony Cross Road, B4220, a distance of approximately 306 metres (335 yards) north-east of Nashend farm and proceeding in a northerly and then in a north-easterly direction for approximately 41 metres (45 yards) to a point approximately 92 metres (101 yards) east of 2 Pow Green.

(2) to divert that length of footpath No. BZ55A in the Parish of Bosbury commencing at the said point on the Class II Bosbury to Stony Cross Road, B4220, a distance of approximately 310 metres (340 yards) north-east of Nashend farm and proceeding in a north-easterly direction for approximately 37 metres (41 yards) to a point approximately 100 metres (110 yards) east of 2 Pow Green, to a line commencing at the said point approximately 100 metres (110 yards) east of 2 Pow Green and proceeding in a north-westerly direction for approximately 12 metres (14 yards) to a point approximately 94 metres (103 yards) east-north-east of 2 Pow Green.
