*The Trunk Road (Various Streets, Oswestry) (Traffic Regulation) (Variation) Order 1979*

The Secretary of State for Transport proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and by Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 on that length of the Swansea-Manchester Trunk Road (A483) known as Beatrice Street in the district of Oswestry in the county of Salop.

The Order, if made, will vary the Trunk Road (Various Streets, Oswestry) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1971 to allow vehicles to wait (except for the purpose of loading and unloading) in the lay-by adjacent to toilet facilities situated on the south-eastern side of Beatrice Street, for 10 minutes in any hour.

*The Trunk Road (A34 Fillybrooks, Stone) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1979*

The Secretary of State for Transport intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and by Schedule 6 of the Road Traffic Act 1974, on the Winchester-Preston Trunk Road (A34) known locally as "the Fillybrooks" lying in the borough of Stafford in the county of Staffordshire.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting at any time on the west side of the access road to the Wayfarer Hotel and Stone Golf Club, from its junction with the main carriageway of the trunk road to its junction with Yarnfield Lane.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building, industrial or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic or the maintenance of the road or services therein. Disabled persons will be exempt from the waiting restrictions for periods of up to 2 hours.

The disinfectants deleted may, however, continue to be used as approved disinfectants until 30th June 1979.
