#### HUMBERSIDE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Humberside (Glanford Borough) (Chemical Lane, Barton-upon-Humber) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1979.*

Notice is hereby given that on 26th January 1979, the Humberside County Council made this Order which will be operative from 19th February 1979 and will make it unlawful for any vehicle to wait on both sides of Chemical Lane, Barton-upon-Humber, from the access to the Albright and Wilson Limited car park in a southerly direction for a distance of 60 metres.

Exemptions will include permission to wait for the purposes of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading, the maintenance of roads and gas, electricity and water supplies.

#### GREATER MANCHESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

*Great Ancoats Street Bus Priority Scheme, Manchester*

Notice is hereby given that on 6th February 1979 the Greater Manchester County Council made Orders in con-

nection with the Great Ancoats Street Bus Priority Scheme under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974. The Orders and their effects are as follows:

*The Greater Manchester County (Great Ancoats Street, Manchester) (Reserved Bus Lane) (County) Order 1978.*

To prohibit on a permanent basis all vehicles other than buses and cycles from proceeding in the near side lane of the south-west carriageway of Great Ancoats Street between Allum Street and Newton Street before the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Monday to Saturday. The Order at present exists on an experimental basis.

The Order contains exemptions to permit vehicles to enter the bus lane for the purposes of boarding or alighting, loading or unloading when not prohibited, building operations or work on or under the length of road.

*The Greater Manchester County (Great Ancoats Street and Newton Street, Manchester) (Prohibition of Left Hand Turn) (County) Order 1978.*

To prohibit on a permanent basis all vehicles except buses from making the left hand turn from Great Ancoats Street into Newton Street. The Order at present exists on an experimental basis.

Copies of the Orders which come into operation on 5th March 1979 and a plan showing the roads to which they relate may be inspected between 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday at the County Secretary's Office, County Hall (Minshull Street entrance), Piccadilly Gardens, Manchester.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained in them on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended as aforesaid, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, may within 6 weeks from 6th February 1979, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

#### NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Northumberland (Village Road B.1326 Cramlington) (Prohibition of Driving) Order*

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Northumberland propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of this Order, if made, will be to prohibit any vehicle from proceeding along that length of Village Road (B.1326) from Northumbrian Road westwards to the Western boundary fence of Hillcrest School in Cramlington. Exemptions will be included in the Order to allow cyclists and the Emergency Services to use the length of road.

A copy of the draft Order which, together with a map showing the length of road involved and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at the offices of the Secretary, Blyth Valley Borough Council, Council Offices, Seaton Delaval, Whitley Bay and at the address given below during normal office hours on weekdays (Saturdays and Public Holidays excepted).
