

- also include the revocation of the existing one way traffic flow in Laburnum Street between its junction with East Street and its junction with St. Efrides Road.
- (2) To prohibit waiting at any time in East Street, north side, from its junction with Laburnum Row for a distance of 30 metres in a westerly direction, at Torquay in the Borough of Torbay.
- (3) To prohibit the driving of a vehicle into the "boxed area" on the carriageway of South Street, Torquay at or near its junction with East Street which will be marked by cross-hatched yellow lines bounded by a yellow line placed on the carriageway, unless the way is clear for such vehicle to proceed immediately out of the boxed area.

Exemptions in the Order relating to (1) above will permit the driving of vehicles in that length of road in connection with building operations, road repairs, supply of gas, water and electricity, for emergency purposes or in the service of a local authority or statutory undertakers in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Exemptions in the Order relating to (2) above will permit waiting for the purpose of boarding and alighting, loading or unloading, Post Office services, maintenance of the road, supply of gas, water and electricity, pursuance of statutory powers or duties, taking in petrol, oil or air from a garage. The statutory exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles are included.

Nothing in the Order relating to (3) above will apply to anything done on the direction of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden or to a vehicle used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes, or to a vehicle the driver of which when entering the boxed area had reasonable cause to believe that he would immediately be able to drive the vehicle out of that area.

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Charles Street, Plymouth) (Experimental Reserved Bus Lane) (Extension No. 1) Order 1977.

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Union Street and Laburnum Row, Torquay) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that on 2nd February 1979, the Devon County Council made an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act

1967 as amended, varying existing waiting restrictions in Laburnum Row and Union Street, Torquay.

When the Order comes into effect on 11th February 1979, you will not be permitted to leave your vehicle:

- (1) At any time in the following length of road:

Laburnum Row, west side, from its junction with East Street for a distance of 16 yards in a northerly direction.

- (2) For a longer period than 1 hour (no return within 1 hour) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily in the following lengths of road:

Union Street

North side, from a point 5 yards east of its junction with Upton Road to a point 13 yards east of its junction with Upton Road.

North-east side, from the boundary between Nos. 215 and 217 to the boundary between Nos. 217 and 219 (a distance of 7 yards).

Exemptions in the Order permit waiting for the purpose of boarding and alighting, loading or unloading, Post Office services, maintenance of the road, supply of gas, water and electricity, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, taking in petrol, oil or air from a garage. The statutory exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles are included.
