The County of Hereford and Worcester (Silver Street, Worcester) (Off Street Parking Place) Order 1979

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Church Street, Hereford) (Prohibition of Driving and Waiting) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that on 2nd February 1979 the County Council of Hereford and Worcester made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which will be to prohibit any motor vehicle from proceeding or waiting in Church Street in the city of Hereford in the county of Hereford and Worcester.

Vehicles of the undermentioned classes or for the undermentioned purposes are exempted from the provisions of the Order:

1. the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from premises in the road affected provided the vehicle does not wait in the road for any period exceeding thirty minutes (no return within 1 hour);
2. to enable certain essential works to be carried out or in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
3. disabled persons' vehicles displaying a badge issued under the Local Authority's Orange Badge Scheme waiting for not more than 2 hours (no return within 1 hour);
4. street cleansing vehicles.

The Order will come into operation on 12th February 1979.
