Gascoyne Way to its junction with Pegs Lane.

(2) Pegs Lane

- East and west sides from a point 65 metres or thereabouts south of the northern end (closed end) thereof southwards for a distance of 74 metres.
- (b) Castle Street, Bishop's Stortford (Prohibition of Wait-ing) Order (No. 49) 1978

The effect of this Order is to:
