#### CANTERBURY CITY COUNCIL

##### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 210

*The City of Canterbury (Footpath 62, Westbere) (Public Path Diversion) Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 26th January 1979 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Canterbury City Council. The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of the public right of way known as Footpath 62, Westbere which commences at a point 17 metres south-west of the southern boundary of the Canterbury to Ramsgate railway (hereinafter called "the commencement point") and runs in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 110 metres to its junction with the access road leading to Sturry quarry, Westbere (hereinafter called "the terminal point") to a line running in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 84 metres from the commencement point and thence in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 86 metres to the terminal point.

The purpose of the diversion is to enable development to take place in accordance with the planning permission that has been granted. A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the City Secretary's Department, 41 Old Dover Road, Canterbury, CT1 3DH during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection in respect of the Order may be sent in writing to the City Secretary, Canterbury City Council, 41 Old Dover Road, Canterbury, CT1 3DH, not later than 12th March 1979, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn, the Canterbury City Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

##### *Totton District Plan*

Notice is hereby given that the Hampshire County Council have prepared the above-named local plan. The plan relates to land within the county district of New Forest. The plan area is bounded by the rivers Test and Blackwater in the east and follows the parish boundary of Totton and Eling to the north and south. On the western edge of the plan area the boundary north of Ringwood Road (A.336) is formed by the proposed Marchwood/Ower Link Road; it continues south between the settlements of Ashurst Bridge and Netley Marsh, and then follows the Totton and Eling Parish boundary around Ashurst.

Certified copies of the plan, the background papers and of the statement mentioned in section 12 (3) of the Act have been deposited at the offices of the Secretaries and Planning Officers of each of the following local authorities and are available for inspection free of charge during normal office hours:

Any persons making objections may send a written request to the undersigned if they wish to be notified of the decision on the plan.
