

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish the public rights of way over parts of footpaths 359, 360 and 374 off Hinde House Lane and Wensley Street, Winco-bank and to create alternative highways in lieu.

This Order becomes operative as from 9th February 1979, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks of 9th February 1979, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The Tameside Metropolitan Borough Council (Footpaths Nos. 121 and 123 Ashton-under-Lyne) Diversion Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that the above named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 23rd January 1979, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Tameside Metropolitan Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification will be to divert the public rights of way over land to the west of Furness Avenue and to the south of Newmarket Road as follows:

Footpath No. 121 diverted for a distance of approximately 75 metres to the northerly side of the existing footpath.
Footpath No. 123 diverted from its junction with Newmarket Grove to a point 21 metres to the south-east of its junction with footpath No. 121.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representation and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

The District of Waveney (Carlton Colville Footpath No. 9 (Part) and Lowestoft Footpath No. 23 (Part))—Public Path Diversion Order 1978.

Notice is hereby given that on 22nd January 1979 Waveney District Council confirmed the above as an unopposed Order.

The first effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification will be to divert that part of the Footpath No. 9 in the Parish of Carlton Colville which runs from a point some 152.5 metres along the path from Uplands Road to a point 81 metres further along the same section of footpath and the diversion will zig-zag across the existing route of the footpath from the first point referred to above in an southerly direction for approximately 12.5 metres and then in a south-east direction for approximately 29 metres and then in a southerly direction for approximately 15 metres and then in south-easterly direction for approximately 12.5 metres and then in a southerly direction for approximately 12.5 metres to joint the existing line of footpath.

The second effect of the Order will be to divert small sections of Footpath No. 9 at Carlton Colville and Footpath No. 23 at Lowestoft at the junction of these footpaths, namely the last 6 metres approximately of Footpath No.
