

the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected ;

- (f) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising, in the streets or lengths of streets referred to in sub-paragraph (c) above will be prohibited.

3. The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2 (c) and (d) above will not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g., the picking up or setting down of passengers ; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties ; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations ; to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" will apply.

4. A copy of each of the Orders, which will come into operation on 19th February 1979, and of the Hackney (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1977 and of the Tower Hamlets (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 (and of the Orders which have previously amended those Orders) can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders were made in Room B.21, The County Hall, London, SE1 7PB.

5. Copies of the Orders may be purchased from the Information Centre, Greater London Council, The County Hall, London, SE1 7PB.

6. Any person desiring to question the validity of either of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or on the ground that any requirement of those sections of the Act or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or of any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to either of the Orders may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

Alie Street.

Bell Lane, between its junction with Wentworth Street and the northern kerb line of Cobb Street.

Brick Lane ;

- (a) the east side between the northern kerb line of Old Montague Street and a point 1.52 metres south of the southern kerb line of Grimsby Street ;

- (b) the west side, between the northern kerb line of Wentworth Street and a point 17.68 metres south of the southern kerb line of Sclater Street.

Cheshire Street, between the eastern kerb line of Brick Lane and the eastern kerb line of Hereford Street.

Commercial Road ;

- (a) the north side, between a point opposite the eastern wall of Commercial Road Fire Station and a point 23.16 metres east of the south-eastern kerb line of Goodman's Stile ;

- (b) the south side, between a point opposite the party wall of Nos. 30 and 30A Commercial Road and a point 23.16 metres east of the south-eastern kerb line of Goodman's Stile.

Goodman's Stile.

Leman Street, between the south-eastern kerb lines of Camperdown Street and Buckle Street and the north-western kerb line of Alie Street.

Manningtree Street.

Quaker Street.

Toynbee Street, between a point opposite the party wall of Nos. 20 and 22 Toynbee Street and a point 13.72 metres south of the southern kerb line of White's Row.

Tyne Street.

Vallance Road, between its junction with Whitechapel Road and the north-western kerb line of Old Montague Street.

Wentworth Street, between the north-eastern kerb line of Commercial Street and the south-western kerb line of Gunthorpe Street.

Whitechapel High Street, the south-east side, between a point 24.38 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerb line of Commercial Road and the south-western kerb line of White Church Lane.

Whitechapel Road, between its junction with Whitechapel High Street and the south-western kerb line of Fieldgate Street.

White Church Lane.

SCHEDULE 2

Brick Lane ;

- (a) the east side, between the southern kerb line of Sclater Street and a point 1.52 metres south of the southern kerb line of Grimsby Street ;

- (b) the west side, between the southern kerb line of Sclater Street and a point 17.68 metres south of that kerb line.

SCHEDULE 3

Fort Street, between its junction with Artillery Lane and a point 18.29 metres south of the south-eastern kerb line of Brushfield Street.

Gun Street.

Steward Street, between its junction with Artillery Lane and the south-eastern kerb line of Brushfield Street.

Toynbee Street, between the southern kerb line of White's Row and a point 13.72 metres south of that kerb line. (069)
