The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way known as Footpath No. 23 (part) Cookham over the land situate at and known as Cookham Dean Cricket Club shown by a red line on the map annexed to the Order between the points marked A and B to a line shown by a blue line on the map annexed to the Order between the points marked A and C.

The Wyre Forest District Council (Footpath No. 20 Wilden Top, Stourport-on-Severn) (No. 1) Diversion Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 16th February 1979 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or is to be confirmed by the Wyre Forest District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from a point along the private drive leading from Wilden Top Road, Stourport-on-Severn to the property known as "Wilden Croft", at a distance of 119 metres along the said drive west of its junction with Wilden Top Road and

proceeding from that point in a west-south-westerly direction for a distance of 197 metres, which comprises part of Footpath No. 20 Stourport-on-Severn (Third Revised Definitive Map), the diversion commencing at a point along the said private drive leading from Wilden Top Road, Stourport-on-Severn to the property known as "Wilden Croft" at a distance of 119 metres along the said private drive west of its junction with Wilden Top Road and proceeding in a westerly direction for a distance of 84 metres from that point, thence in a south-south-westerly direction for a distance of 116 metres to the southern boundary of Field O.S. 7132, thence in a westerly direction along the said southern boundary of Field O.S. 7132 for a distance of 39 metres and thence proceeding in a north-westerly direction along the said southern boundary of Field O.S. 7132 for a distance of 65 metres to rejoin the existing and defined route of Footpath No. 20.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from a point along the private drive leading from Wilden Top Road, Stourport-on-Severn to the property known as "Wilden Croft", at a distance of 201 metres along the said private drive west of its junction with Wilden Top Road and proceeding from that point in an east-south-easterly direction for a distance of 158 metres, which comprises part of Footpath No. 21 Stourport-on-Severn (Third Revised Definitive Map), the diversion commencing at a point along the said private drive leading from Wilden Top Road, Stourport-on-Severn to the property known as "Wilden Croft" at a distance of 201 metres along the said private drive, west of its junction with Wilden Top Road, thence in a south-south-westerly direction for a distance of 116 metres to the southern boundary of Field O.S. 7132 and thence in an easterly direction along the said southern boundary of Field O.S. 7132 for a distance of 111 metres terminating at the point where it rejoins the existing and defined route of Footpath No. 21.
