HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The Cemmaes Road—Mallwyd Trunk Road (Improvement Between Dolcorsllwyn and Dolysgallog) Order 1977
and

The Cemmaes Road—Mallwyd Trunk Road (Improvement Between Dolcorsllwyn and Dolysgallog Side Roads) Order 1977

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

(1) an Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959 providing:

(a) that roads about 156 metres and 105 metres in length which he proposes to construct between Dolcorsllwyn and Dolysgallog in the County of Powys shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation, and

(2) an Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising him:

(a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter the class 3 road (C81) to Aberangell;

(b) to stop up the superseded lengths of the existing trunk road and lengths of the public footpaths, numbered 16 and 18 and public bridleway No. 15;

(c) to construct new highways to connect the class 3 road (C81) to Aberangell, public footpath No. 16 and public bridleway No. 15 with the trunk road;

(d) to stop up private means of access to premises, and

(e) to provide new means of access to premises, all between Dolcorsllwyn and Dolysgallog aforesaid and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Powys as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Orders and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 22nd February 1979 to 5th April 1979 at the Welsh Office, Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff and at the offices of Powys County Council, Highways Area Office, The Park, Newtown, Powys; Montgomery District Council, Area Office, Machynlleth, Powys and at the Post Office, Cwm Llinau, near Cemmaes, Machynlleth, Powys.

Any person may not later than 5th April 1979 object to the making of the Orders, by notice to the Secretary of State at the Welsh Office, Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL, quoting reference WR11/6/41 and stating the grounds of objection. In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.
