#### NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

##### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

##### *The Aylesbury Vale District Council (Footpath No. 6 Parish of Wing) Public Path Diversion Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that on 16th February 1979 the Aylesbury Vale District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way specified in the First Schedule to this notice to a line specified in the Second Schedule of the said Notice.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Aylesbury Vale District Council Offices, The Mall, Friars Square, Aylesbury, during normal office hours.

This Order becomes operative as from the date on which the Aylesbury Vale District Council certify that the new path has been created to their satisfaction, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirements of that Act or any regulation made hereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order he may, under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from 22nd February 1979, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE

##### *Description of Site of Existing Path or Way*

Commencing from its entrance off the Wing/Leighton Buzzard trunk road; thence continuing in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 10 metres; then turning in a north-north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 8 metres. The existing path has a width throughout of approximately 1 metre.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE

##### *Description of Site of Alternative Highway*

Commencing approximately 10 metres east of the existing footpath entrance off the Wing/Leighton Buzzard trunk road; thence continuing in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 12 metres; then turning north-north-easterly for a distance of approximately 10 metres; then lastly turning east and bearing generally northerly for a distance of approximately 78 metres. The new footpath has a width throughout of 1.8 metres.

##### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971—SECTION 210

##### *The Braintree District Council (Part of Footpath No. 2, Halstead) Public Path Diversion Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 16th February

1979, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Braintree District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way situated at Ordnance Survey Fields numbered 7900 and 9300 Sheet No. TL 8129 (1968 Revision) and running from a point approximately 76 yards in a generally south-easterly direction from the eastern end of the highway known as Balls Chase, Halstead and continuing in a south-easterly direction for approximately 116 yards to a line running from the aforementioned point and then following the line of the footways to be constructed in connection with the development of the site firstly in a generally south-easterly direction for approximately 90 yards secondly in a generally north-easterly direction for approximately 26 yards and finally in a northerly direction for approximately 10 yards where it rejoins the existing route of footpath No. 2.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn the Braintree District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

##### *The South Cambridgeshire District Council (Footpath No. 2—Over) Public Path Diversion Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 2nd February 1979, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the South Cambridgeshire District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of Public Footpath No. 2 at Over leading from New Road to the Doles and running from a point approximately 58 yards north-east of New Road in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 144 yards to its junction with the Doles (as shown A-B on the map contained in the Order) to run from a point approximately 58 yards north-east of New Road in a general easterly and north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 190 yards and thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 10 yards to a point at the Doles approximately 15 yards south-east of the existing path (as shown A-C on the map contained in the Order).

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Office of the Secretary, South Cambridgeshire District Council, Great Eastern House, Tenison Road, Cambridge, and may be inspected free of charge on Mondays to Fridays during normal office hours, and also at the residence of the Clerk to the Over Parish Council, 18 King Street, Over, Cambridge, where it may be inspected at all reasonable times.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned not later than 21st March 1979 and should state the grounds on which it is made. If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the South Cambridgeshire District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations
