ALLERDALE DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Allerdale (Workington Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the Allerdale District Council propose to make an Order under section 31 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Local Government Act 1974 to control the use of the parking place named in the Schedule to this notice, which shows the class of vehicles and the days and times of operation and the maximum period for waiting in the parking place.

When leaving a vehicle in the parking place during the limited waiting hours the driver is required to show the time of his arrival by setting and displaying a parking disc. The vehicle may wait during the limited waiting hours for a maximum period of two hours.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Bedfordshire County Council (Imposition of Speed Limits on Longholme Way, Bedford)

Notice is hereby given that on 21st February 1979, the Bedfordshire County Council with the consent of the Secretary of State for Transport made Orders under sections 72, 73 and 74 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to impose a speed limit of 30 m.p.h. on the length

of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice and a speed limit of 40 m.p.h. on the length of road specified in Schedule 2.
