

CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

1. *The County of Cambridgeshire (Various Streets, Whittlesey) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1979*
2. *The County of Cambridgeshire (Blunts Lane, Whittlesey) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1979*
3. *The County of Cambridgeshire (Plough Road, Whittlesey) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that on 19th February 1979, the Cambridgeshire County Council made Orders under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to introduce new traffic management proposals for the central area of Whittlesey. The proposed Orders of the new restrictions also revoke existing Orders.

The following roads are being affected by the proposals:

Order No. 1 contains exemptions to allow a vehicle to wait for as long as may be necessary to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded; to enable a person to board or alight; to enable it to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition and the maintenance of essential services and to allow a disabled persons vehicle to wait for up to two hours.

The Orders will come into operation on 12th March 1979, a copies thereof and maps showing the roads to which they relate may be inspected at the office of the undersigned and at the office of the Office Manager, Fenland District Council, Queen Street, Whittlesey, during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 19th February 1979, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

CHESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Cheshire County Council (Bexton Road, Knutsford) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that Cheshire County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting by vehicles at all times on that length of Bexton Road, Knutsford, in the Borough of Macclesfield which extends from a point 15 metres south-east of the entrance to Cranford Lodge Hospital in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 30 metres (approximately 32 yards).

The proposed Order will contain exemptions in respect of disabled persons' vehicles and to allow a vehicle to wait in the restricted length of road for as long as may be necessary to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded, to enable a person to board or alight and to enable it to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition and the maintenance of essential services.

A copy of the proposed Order, together with a map showing the length of road concerned and a statement of the County Council's reasons for making the Order may be

CORNWALL COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Cornwall (Launceston) (Experimental Restrictions on Driving) (Extension No. 1) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 15th February 1979 the Cornwall County Council by Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, have directed that the County of Cornwall (Launceston) (Experimental Restrictions on Driving) Order 1978 shall continue in force until 24th August 1979.

The effect of the Order is to regulate traffic at Launceston by prohibiting any vehicle from being driven in the length of road specified in the Schedule hereto.

Exceptions are provided in the Order in connection with access to premises; to enable postal packets to be delivered or collected; in connection with statutory powers or duties, agriculture or forestry, building operations and the maintenance or improvement of the length of road or of the services therein.

A copy of the Order, together with a map showing the length of road referred to therein, will be available for public inspection between the hours of 9.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. to 4 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive, at the County Hall, Truro.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Act or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or any regulation made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within 6 weeks of the date first mentioned above make application for the purpose to the High Court.

CUMBRIA COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Cumbria (Broadgate, Grasmere) (Street Parking Places) Order 197

Notice is hereby given that the Cumbria County Council propose to make an Order under sections 28 (1) and 31 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of this Order will be to authorise the use of the part of road specified in the Schedule to this notice as a parking place for motor cars, motor cycles and invalid carriages on any day from Good Friday to 30th September inclusive in each year between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. for a period not exceeding 30 minutes, return prohibited within 1 hour.

An exemption will permit unlimited waiting for invalid carriages and by disabled persons' vehicles in accordance with the Orange Badge Scheme.
