

Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be

- (i) to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time in any of the lengths of road at St. Blazey specified in the Schedule hereto.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to allow a vehicle to wait for:

(a) periods not exceeding 2 hours (return prohibited within 1 hour) if the vehicle is a disabled person's vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge and a parking disc in accordance with the appropriate Regulations, and

(b) so long as may be necessary to allow a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded; to enable postal packets to be delivered or collected; in connection with statutory powers or duties, building operations, the maintenance or improvement of the lengths of road or of the services therein; to take in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage; and in connection with a funeral;

- (ii) to amend existing traffic regulation Orders at St. Blazey as necessary to give effect to the foregoing.

The County of Cornwall (Flushing) (Trefusis Road) (Restrictions on Waiting) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the Cornwall County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 the effect of which will be:

- (i) to prohibit the waiting of vehicles

(a) between 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily from 1st May to 30th September (both dates inclusive) in each year in the length of road at Flushing in the Parish of Mylor specified in the First Schedule hereto;

(b) at any time in the length of road at Flushing in the Parish of Mylor specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to allow a vehicle to wait for (a) periods not exceeding 2 hours (return prohibited within 1 hour) if the vehicle is a disabled person's vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge and a parking disc in accordance with the appropriate Regulations, and (b) so long as may be necessary to allow a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded; to enable postal packets to be delivered or collected; in connection with statutory powers or duties, building operations, the maintenance or improvement of the lengths of road or of the services therein; to take in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage; and in connection with a funeral;

- (ii) to revoke The County of Cornwall (Flushing) (Seasonal Restrictions on Waiting) Order 1977.
