The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the award of The Queen's Gallantry Medal to the undermentioned:

24168345 Corporal Alan John WILLIAMS, Corps of Royal Engineers.

Corporal Williams was a member of the Army Long Distance canoe team which gathered in Scotland for the Inter Services long distance canoe race held on the River Tay from Kinclaven to Perth. On the 15th September 1978 at about 17.30 hours he was taking part in a practice run down the course in a K1 single handed canoe. The water level in the river was high due to heavy overnight rain, but conditions had been assessed as not being too bad for a practice run to take place. All members of the team were wearing life jackets. At Campsie Lynn near Stanley two K2 canoes capsized whilst shooting a rapid and one crew member from each boat was left holding onto the boats which were drawn into a large whirlpool below the rapids. Corporal Williams, showing great courage and skill shot the rapids and went into the whirlpool to attempt the rescue of the two crew members.

He succeeded in getting one of them onto the back of his boat and towed him to safety. He then went back into the whirlpool to try to rescue the second man. He succeeded in getting him onto the back of his boat but was unable to break free from the pool. The second man was unable to keep hold of the boat and disappeared beneath the water. The first soldier had meanwhile been drawn back into the whirlpool and was holding onto a log. Corporal Williams showing great presence of mind returned and managed to tow him to safety again after 3 or 4 minutes. He then returned to look for the second soldier but was unable to find him after an extensive search. Although other members of the canoe team were in the vicinity at the time, none were in a position to go to the assistance of the two soldiers in the water.

Throughout the incident Corporal Williams showed great courage and skill and acted with complete disregard for his own safety in a very difficult situation.
