That part of the footpath in the Town of Petersfield in the District of East Hampshire shown on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way prepared under Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 as Footpath No. 8 which commences at a point 510 metres from its junction with Road A272 and runs south-eastwards for 248 metres.

##### Part II. Description of Site of Alternative Highway

A 1.8 metre grass and earth path which commences at the northern end of the path described in Part I of this Schedule and runs south-south-eastwards for 172 metres then gradually veering south-eastwards for 52 metres then east-north-eastwards for 142 metres to a stile and reconnecting with the existing footpath. A total distance of 366 metres.

*The Lancashire County Council (Footpath No. 33, Leyland: Unnumbered Right of Way known as Mill Lane, Leyland; and Unnumbered Footpath from Mill Lane to rear of Nos. 18 and 20 Redwood Avenue, Leyland, South Ribblesdale Borough) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1979.*

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish Footpath No. 33, Leyland from Redwood Avenue to Mill Lane, a distance of 113 metres (123 yards) approximately; the unnumbered right of way known as Mill Lane from Footpath No. 33 for a distance of 185 metres (202 yards) approximately to a point north of Tarn Cottages; and the unnumbered footpath from the junction of Footpath No. 33 with Mill Lane to the rear of the properties Nos. 18 and 20 Redwood Avenue, Leyland.

The alternative route will be via Redwood Avenue and Briarwood Close.

*The County Council of Somerset (Footpath No. 12/42 at Walton) Public Path Diversion Order 1979*
