The effect of the Order as confirmed is to create a public footpath at the present terminal point to Southwell Footpath No. 1 at a point approximately 25 yards south of Upton Mill and following the southern bank of the River Greet in a north-westerly then westerly then southerly then south-westerly then westerly direction to join Southwell Footpath No. 2 at the footbridge over the River Greet approximately 300 yards west-south-west of Upton Mill.

Epperstone Footpath No. 1

Running from a point on the Farm Occupation Road approximately 1,112 yards south-east of Park Farm in a north-westerly then west-north-westerly then north-north-westerly then north-westerly direction to join up with the present terminal point of Oxton Footpath No. 3 at a point on the Parish boundary with Oxton approximately 400 yards west-north-west of Park Farm, to a line running from a point on the Farm Occupation Road approximately 1,112 yards south-east of Park Farm and travelling along the said Occupation Road in a generally north-westerly direction up to, and through Park Farm then in a south-westerly then west-north-westerly then northerly then westerly direction to join up with the proposed new terminal point of Oxton Footpath No. 3 at a point on the Parish boundary with Oxton approximately 385 yards north-west of Park Farm.
