CREWE AND NANTWICH BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Crewe and Nantwich (Borough of Crewe No. 4) (Prohibition of Waiting) (Second Amendment) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that on 17th May 1979, the Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council pursuant to arrangements

made with the Cheshire County Council under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 and in exercise of the powers of the said County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972 and of all other enabling powers.

The effect of this Order is to prohibit waiting by vehicles in the lengths of streets detailed in the first column for the time specified in the second column in the Schedule below.

Exemptions will permit waiting for the purposes of loading and unloading and for picking up and setting down passengers and limited waiting for disabled persons' vehicles.

The Order will come into operation on 28th May 1979. A copy of the Order, together with a map showing the restricted area may be examined during the usual office hours at the Information Centre, Delamere House, Delamere Street, Crewe.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Act or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of sections 84(a), 84(b), 84(c) of the Act or any regulation made under the said section 84(c) has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order is made, make application for the purpose.

Proposed Borough of Crewe and Nantwich (John Street, Crewe) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council pursuant to arrangements made with the Cheshire County Council under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council, propose to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and of all other enabling powers.

The effect of this Order will be to prohibit the driving of vehicles in that length of John Street, Crewe, from its junction with Victoria Street northwards for a distance of 20 metres in a direction other than from south to north.
