GREATER MANCHESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

Lloyd Road, Levenshulme, Manchester

Notice is hereby given that on 31st May 1979 the Greater Manchester County Council made Orders under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972. The Orders and their effects are as follows:

The Greater Manchester County (Lloyd Road, Manchester) (Restriction of Waiting) (County) Order 1978

To prohibit waiting between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Monday to Saturday and to prohibit loading and unloading between 7 a.m. and 10 a.m. on Monday to Saturday and between 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. on Monday to Friday on:

Lloyd Road, Levenshulme, northern carriageway, north side from Stockport Road to Kirk Road;

Lloyd Road, Levenshulme, southern carriageway, south side from Kirk Road to Stockport Road.

The Order contains exemptions to permit vehicles to wait for the purposes of boarding or alighting, loading and unloading (when not prohibited), building operations or work on or under the lengths of road. Disabled person's vehicles bearing a disabled person's badge and a parking disc will be able to wait for periods of up to two hours when a loading ban is not in operation.

The Greater Manchester County (Lloyd Road, Manchester) (One Way Traffic) (County) Order 1978

To impose one way working on:

The northern carriageway of *Lloyd Road* from Stockport Road to Kirk Road in that direction;

The southern carriageway of *Lloyd Road* from Kirk Road to Stockport Road in that direction.

The Greater Manchester County (Lloyd Road, Manchester) (Street Parking Place) (County) Order 1978

To create a parking place for public service vehicles in the central area of *Lloyd Road*, approximately 300 square metres in area.

Copies of the Orders which come into operation on 4th June 1979 and a plan showing the road to which they relate may be inspected between 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday at the County Secretary's Office, County Hall (Minshull Street entrance), Piccadilly Gardens, Manchester.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained in them on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended as aforesaid, on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, may within 6 weeks from 31st May 1979 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

GREATER MANCHESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The Greater Manchester County (Manchester Road/Hadbutt Lane, Astley) (Prohibition of Waiting) (County) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that on 22nd May 1979 the Greater Manchester County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting at any time on:

A572 Manchester Road, Astley

North side, from a point 205 metres west of Hadbutt Lane to a point 15 metres east of Hadbutt Lane.

South side, from a point 135 metres west of Windmill Lane to a point 15 metres east of Windmill Lane.

Hadbutt Lane, Astley, both sides, from Manchester Road for a distance of 15 metres in a northerly direction.

The Order contains exemptions to permit waiting for the purposes of board or alighting, loading or unloading, building operations or work on or under the lengths of road. Disabled person's vehicles bearing a disabled person's badge and a parking disc will be allowed to park for a period of up to 2 hours return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the Order which comes into operation on 16th July 1979 and the plans to which it relates may be inspected between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays at:

(a) The County Secretary's Office, County Hall, Piccadilly Gardens, Manchester, or

(b) The Director of Administrations Office, Wigan Borough Council, Civic Centre, Millgate, Wigan.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirements of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from 22nd May 1979 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

MIDDLESBROUGH BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Middlesbrough Borough Council (Whin Street/Thorne Street Area) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the Middlesbrough Borough Council acting as agents for the Highway Authority Cleveland County Council have made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Cleveland Constabulary.

The Order will come into effect on 1st June 1979 and from that date waiting by vehicles will be prohibited between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday on both sides of the unnamed service road which lies between Whin Street and Thorne Street in Middlesbrough.

There are certain exemptions from the effect of the Order which include an exemption in favour of disabled persons vehicles displaying a disabled persons badge.

Full details are contained in the Order which together with a map showing the restricted road may be examined between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Monday to Friday at the Borough Secretary's Department Municipal Buildings, Middlesbrough, Cleveland and the Information Centre, 125 Albert Road, Middlesbrough.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any of the requirements of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 1st June 1979 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
