TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 210

Horsham District Council (Rusper) Public Path No. 1548 (Two Sections) Diversion Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 30th May 1979 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Horsham District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to:

- (a) Divert that section of public footpath No. 1548 commencing approximately 6 metres to the west of the gate on the eastern side of O.S. Parcel No. 5400 (T.Q. Sheet No. 2336) and of grid reference 2356 3598 shown as point D on the plan in the Order, and extending thereafter eastwards for a distance of approximately 32 metres to a point C of grid reference 2361 3597, and shown by a red line between points D and C on the plans contained in the Order.
- (b) Create a new length of footpath 1548 to replace that section described in (a) above, commencing from the said point D (as described above) of grid reference 2356 3598, and extending in an easterly direction, following a proposed estate footpath to point C (as described above), as shown by a blue line between the points D and C on the plans contained in the Order.
- (c) Divert that section of footpath 1548 commencing approximately 77.5 metres east of the gate on the eastern side of O.S. Parcel No. 5400 (T.Q. Sheet No. 2336) shown as point B on the plan contained in the Order and of grid reference 2369 3599, and thereafter extending eastwards for a distance of approximately 153 metres to a point A of grid reference 2386 3601, as shown by a red line between the points B and A on the plans contained in the Order.
- (d) Create a new length of footpath 1548 to replace that section described in (c) above, commencing from the said point B of grid reference 2369 3599 and extending in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 157 metres following a proposed estate footpath, to the said point A of grid reference 2386 3601, as shown by a red line between points B and A on the plans contained in the Order.

A copy of the Order and the plans contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at Chennells House, North Street, Horsham, between the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Thursday and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Friday, and at Crawley Library, Crawley County Buildings, Crawley, between the hours of 9.30 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday to Friday and 9.30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday. Any representation or objection to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned at Park House, North Street, Horsham, West Sussex, and should be received not later than 29th June 1979 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn the Horsham District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
