The Nottinghamshire County Council (Bridleway No. 2 Walesby) Public Path Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that on 4th June 1979 the Nottinghamshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from the footbridge on Bevercotes Beck in the Parish of Walesby on a line just south of the Parish boundary with Haughton to Retford Road to a line running from the footbridge on Beverscotes Beck on a line veering between 120 and 150 yards south of the existing right of way to Retford Road then travelling on the inside of the field adjacent to Retford Road to the existing terminal point.

The Order becomes operative as from 7th June 1979, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 7th June 1979, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

Powys County Council (Community of Ystradfellte; Footpath No. 23 at Cwm-Porth Ystradfellte) Public Path Diversion Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 31st May 1979 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Wales for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the County Council of Powys.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the Public Right of Way running from County Class III Road C190 in a southerly direction around the farm premises known as Cwm-Porth to a line running from a point on Footpath No. 24 Ystradfellte, approximately halfway along the eastern boundary of O.S. Field Enclosure No. 1815 in an easterly direction for approximately 220 yards and thence in a southerly direction for approximately 70 yards to rejoin the existing Footpath No. 23.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at Brecon Beacons National Park Office, Glamorgan Street, Brecon, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive.

If you wish to have sent to you in due course a notice to the effect that this Order has been confirmed, and a copy of the Order as confirmed, you should write to The County Solicitor, Powys County Council, Powys County Hall, Llandrindod Wells, Powys, giving your name and address to which these documents may be sent.

Compensation for depreciation or damage in consequence of the coming into operation of this Order is payable in accordance with section 31 113 (2) of the 1959 Act, to which reference should be made.

Any objection or representation concerning the Order may be sent in writing to the County Solicitor, Powys County Council, Powys County Hall, Llandrindod Wells, Powys, before 7th June 1979
