

BRIGHTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Brighton (Madeira Drive Area) (Parking Places and Restricted Waiting Order 1979) (Amendment No. 1) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that on 1st June 1979 the Brighton Borough Council, acting as agents for the East Sussex County Council made the above Order under sections 1, 35, 36, 37, 39 and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972.

The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 11th June 1979, will allow goods vehicles to park in the restricted roads of the Madeira Drive Area, if the goods vehicle displays a permit issued by the Council, and is waiting in the area of restricted road to which the permit relates for the purpose and during the period for which the permit is valid.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the roads affected may be examined at the Enquiry Office, Town Hall, Brighton, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provisions contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, or, on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may, within 6 weeks from 1st June 1979, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Buckinghamshire County Council (Restricted Roads) (No. 2) Order, 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 25th May 1979 the Buckinghamshire County Council made the above-named Order under sections 72 (3) and 73 (1) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, the effect of which is that the length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice will become subject to a speed limit of 30 m.p.h.

This Order will come into operation on 11th June 1979.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 25th May 1979, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Buckinghamshire County Council (Wolverton Central Area) (Experimental Prohibition of Entry of Heavy Commercial Vehicles) (Extension) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that The Buckinghamshire County Council (Wolverton Central Area) (Experimental Prohibition of Entry of Heavy Commercial Vehicles) Order 1978 (hereinafter called "the Order") the effect of which Order is set out in the First Schedule below has been continued in force and will so continue until 19th December 1979.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE

The effect of the Order is that no person will be permitted to cause or permit a heavy commercial vehicle proceedings in any of the roads specified in column 1 of the Second Schedule to this Notice to enter the road specified in relation to that road in column 2 of the said Schedule.

The Order contains exemptions for heavy commercial vehicles being used (a) for goods to be loaded or unloaded; (b) for enabling works to be carried out and (c) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

The Buckinghamshire County Council (Stockleys Lane and Main Street, Tingewick) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that Buckinghamshire County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 of the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which Order will be to prohibit any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to wait at any time on any day in the lengths of road described in the Schedule to this Notice.

Exemptions to the proposed Order will permit the following:

- (1) Waiting with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden.
- (2) Waiting for so long as may be necessary;
 - (a) for persons to board or alight;
 - (b) for goods to be loaded or unloaded;
 - (c) for enabling works to be carried out;
 - (d) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; and
- (3) The waiting of disabled persons' vehicles in accordance with the "Orange Badge" Scheme.

The draft Order which, together with a map showing the length of road concerned and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at:

County Hall, Aylesbury, and at Aylesbury Vale District Council Offices, 2 Bridge Street, Buckingham, during normal office hours.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you should send the grounds for your objections in writing to the undersigned by 6th July 1979.
