DERBYSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The Derbyshire County Council (Various Streets, Ilkeston) (Weight Restriction) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 7th June 1979 the Derbyshire County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of this Order will be to prohibit any person from causing or permitting any vehicle the unladen weight of which exceeds 3 tons to proceed in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order for:

- The purpose of access to premises on or adjacent to the lengths of road.
- The purpose of agriculture in connection with land adjacent to the lengths of road.
- In connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or re-construction, the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of a telegraph line, as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878 in or adjacent to the lengths of road.
- Public Service Vehicle operators and emergency services.
- In the course of military training operations.

The Order is effective from 2nd July 1979.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from 7th June 1979 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
