

WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of West Sussex (Shoreham-by-Sea : Layby on Shoreham-Steyning Road (A283)) (Height and Width Restriction) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that the West Sussex County Council propose to make an Order under the provisions of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to prohibit any vehicle in excess of 6 feet 6 inches in height, and 6 feet 6 inches in width, inclusive of any load on the vehicle, from proceeding in that length of the layby on the eastern side of the Shoreham-Steyning road (A283) in Shoreham-by-Sea, from a point 640 metres north of the roundabout at the Adur Bridge, northwards in the layby to a point 6 metres south of the access road to Old Erringham Farm, a distance of 216 metres.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable vehicles, as described above, to proceed in the length of road referred to, if the vehicle is (a) being used for the purpose of agriculture or the conveyance of timber felled upon land adjacent to that length of road; (b) being used in connection with building operations or the repair of the road or the services therein; (c) being used in an emergency for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes; and (d) being used by a Local Authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

A copy of the draft Order, together with a plan showing the affected length of road, and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at the County Hall, Chichester, during normal office hours, and at the Public Library, St. Mary's Road, Shoreham-by-Sea, during normal Library opening hours. Library staff will not be in a position to answer questions on the proposal and any enquiries should be addressed to the undersigned. Objections to the proposal, together with the grounds on which they are made, must be sent in writing to the undersigned by 29th June 1979.

SOUTH TYNESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of South Tyneside (Off-Street Parking Places, South Shields) Order, 1979
