(a) part of footpath No. 19d, commencing at its junction with the diverted section of footpath No. 21c, extending south-eastwards and southwards for approximately 840 feet, to its junction with footpaths Nos. 19e and 21d, near Awbrook Old Farm, and

(b) part of footpath No. 19e, commencing at its junction with footpaths Nos. 21d and 19d, extending south-westwards for approximately 600 feet, and substituting for these paths a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing at the northern end of the length of footpath No. 19d to be stopped up, extending south-westwards, thence curving south-eastwards, along the western edge of, and across, a meadow, for a total distance of approximately 1,400 feet, to join the southern end of the length of footpath No. 19e to be stopped up.

(2) Extinguished part of the public footpath (Path No. 21d) in the Parish of Lindfield Rural, commencing at its junction with footpaths Nos. 19d and 19e, extending north-westwards for approximately 520 feet.
