NATIONAL COAL BOARD

OPENCAST COAL ACT 1958

Notice is hereby given that the National Coal Board intend to submit an application entitled the Icehouse Application 1979 to the Secretary of State for an authorisation under Section 1 of the Opencast Coal Act 1958 to work coal by opencast operations or to cause or permit coal to be worked by such operations and for an Order under Section 15 of that Act suspending a public right of way. The land which the National Coal Board require to occupy in this connection and the right of way to which the application for the Order relates and the alternative way which the National Coal Board propose to make available are described below. A copy of the application and of the accompanying map may be seen between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Wednesdays and Saturdays, excepting on Bank and Public Holidays, at the Ripley Public Library, Grosvenor Street, Ripley, Derbyshire. Any objection to the application must be made in writing to the Secretary of State at the Department of Energy, Thames House South, Millbank, London SW1P 4QJ before 16th July 1979 and should state whether it is to the grant of the authorisation or to the making of the Order suspending a public right of way and the grounds of objection.

Description of Land

The land which is about 90 acres (about 37 hectares) in extent is in the parish of Ripley in the District of Amber Valley in the County of Derby. It is situated to the north-east of Ripley about 1.5 kilometres north-west of Codnor and lies to the east of Nottingham Road, Ripley (A610) (but does not include the cricket or football grounds) to the west and north-west of the Codnorgate Industrial Estate to the south-west of Butterley Park and the south and south-east of Home Farm. It is bounded on the west in part by Coach Road, Ripley.

The land is included in O.S. Sheet Nos. SK.4050, SK.4051, SK.4150 and SK.4151 (all 1962 Edition) Scale 1/2500.
