Orders affecting various footpaths in the Parish of Barrington

I *The South Cambridgeshire District Council (Barrington No. 3) Public Path Diversion Order 1979*

II *The South Cambridgeshire District Council (Barrington No. 12) Public Path Creation Order 1979*

III *The South Cambridgeshire District Council (Barrington No. 10) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the 3 above-named Orders, made on 1st June 1979, are about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as unopposed Orders by the South Cambridgeshire District Council.

The effect of the Orders, if confirmed without modifications, will be as follows:

(I) *The South Cambridgeshire District Council (Barrington No. 3) Public Path Diversion Order 1979.*

To divert a part of public footpath No. 3 at Barrington leading from Barrington to Harlton, running from a point approximately 543 yards north-west of Wilsmere Down Farm in a north-easterly and north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 657 yards to a point at its junction with public footpath No. 11 (as shown C-D-E on the map contained in the Order) to a line commencing at a point approximately 543 yards north-west of Wilsmere Down Farm and running in a north-westerly and north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 733 yards to a point at the junction of the existing path with public footpath No. 11 (as shown C-F-E on the map contained in the Order), the footpath to be 4 feet in width and the section F-E on the plan to be situated on the south section F-E on the plan to be situated on the south (Barrington) side of the Harlton-Barrington Parish boundary.

(II) *The South Cambridgeshire District Council (Barrington No. 12) Public Path Creation Order 1979*

To create a public footpath 4 feet in width from a point in Whole Way, Barrington, approximately 1,040 yards north-west of the Barrington-Orwell Road, running in a general north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 595 yards to a point approximately 930 yards north-west of Wilsmere Down Farm (as shown G-F on the map contained in the Order), the path to be situated on the south (Barrington) side of the Harlton-Barrington Parish boundary.

(III) *The South Cambridgeshire District Council (Barrington No. 10) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1979*

To extinguish the public right of way running from the roadway over the Green leading to Back Lane, Barrington, at a point approximately 50 yards north-west of High Street in a general north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 1,370 yards to a point on Public Footpath No. 9 approximately 210 yards west of Wilsmere Down Farm (as shown A-B on the map contained in the Order).

Copies of these 3 Orders and the maps contained in them have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices (Great Eastern House, Tenison Road, Cambridge) during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and at the residence of the Clerk to Barrington Parish Council at 10 Bendyshe Way, Barrington, Cambridgeshire, where they may be inspected at all reasonable times.

Any representations or objections with respect to these Orders should be sent in writing to the Secretary of the

Council, Great Eastern House, Tenison Road, Cambridge. Any letter of representation should state clearly

- (a) the particular Order to which the representation relates;
- (b) the grounds on which the objection or representation is made.

Objections or representations must be made on or before 12th July 1979.

If no objections or representations are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the South Cambridgeshire District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

The County Council of Mid Glamorgan (Pontypridd to Beddau Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Mid Glamorgan have made and submitted to the Secretary of State for Wales for confirmation an Order under sections 1 and 62 of the Highways Act 1971 and all other powers authorising the Council:

1. To improve lengths of:

- (a) Factory Lane, Pontypridd.
- (b) The unclassified rear access lane at its junction with the southern side of Factory Lane.
- (2) To stop up Factory Lane from a point 23 metres west of the north-west corner of the property known as "Roslyn" to a point 14 metres east of the junction of Factory Lane with Woodland Road.
- (3) To construct a new highway from a point 34 metres west of the junction of Factory Lane with the Classified Road to a point 13 metres east of the junction of Factory Lane with Woodland Road, Pontypridd.
