The Gwent County Council (School Hill, Station Road, Chepstow) (Parts) (Prohibition of Waiting) (Station Road, Chepstow) (Part) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that the Gwent County Council, in exercise of their powers under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, and by all other powers then enabling in that behalf propose to make an Order, the effect of which will be:

- (1) To prohibit waiting at all times on those lengths of roads as set out in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- (2) To restrict waiting to a period of one half hour between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day on that length of road as set out in Schedule 2 to this Order.

Hertfordshire County Council Temporary Closure of Law Hall Lane, Bendish (Phase 1)
