It is also acknowledged by the French, that the Relistance which the British Forces made in the little Town of Brihuega was almost incredible; if the rest of the Army could have come up to their Relief an Hour or two sooner, the whole fortune of this Affair might have been changed. We hear nothing of Marshal Staremberg ince his Retreat; the Enemy pretend to be able to cut him off, and undoubtedly he must run thro' very great Difficulties to bring his Body of Troops safe into Catalonia. The States Secretary of the Embassy from Constantinople is arrived, with Advice, that the Turks had resolved to declare War against the Muscovites. The necessary Measures are taking here for preserving the Neutrality in Germany, and preventing any ill Confequences from this Rupture to the Affairs of the Allies against France, and Conferences have been held with the Ministers of the Princes concerned upon this Subject.
