## ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

### BEDFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Bedfordshire (Restricted Roads) (No. 12) Order 1979*

*Imposition of 30 m.p.h. Speed Limit on High Street and Cambridge Road, Dunton*

Notice is hereby given that on 4th June 1979, the County Council of Bedfordshire made an Order under section 72 (3) and 73 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order as from 9th July 1979 will be to prohibit the driving of any vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on that length of Route C185 (High Street and Cambridge Road) in Dunton which extends from a point approximately 132 metres east of the C185/C184 crossroads in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 860 metres to a point approximately 66 metres north-east of its junction with Greenfield Way.

### NORTH BEDFORDSHIRE BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The North Bedfordshire Borough Council (Various Roads, Bedford) (Prohibition of Commercial Vehicles of over 3 tons unladen weight) Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the North Bedfordshire Borough Council acting as agents for the Bedfordshire County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2), (3) and (3AA) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, section 1 of the Heavy Commercial Vehicles (Controls and Regulations) Act 1973 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to prohibit, except for access, heavy commercial vehicles of over 3 tons unladen weight from proceeding in the roads listed in the Schedule to this notice.

The Order will contain exemptions for vehicles being used for loading and unloading, building and demolition, removal of obstruction, the carrying out of roadworks, the maintenance of essential services, including vehicles used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes or vehicles used by a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

The draft Order together with a map showing the roads concerned and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at the address below during normal office hours.
