*County Council of South Glamorgan (Rear of Amroth Road, Ely) Public Paths Extinguishment Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that on 5th June 1979 the County Council of South Glamorgan confirmed the above Order as an unopposed Order.

Its effect is to extinguish the public footpaths commencing at the rear of No. 49 Amroth Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 102 metres and two footpaths leading therefrom in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 15 metres and 7 metres respectively.

A copy of the confirmed Order and of the map contained in it may be inspected free of charge at the address below during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 18th June 1979, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

*The County Council of Gwynedd (Footpath 1 NR Beddgelert) Public Path Diversion Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred as "the Order") made on 8th June 1979 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Wales for confirmation or to be confirmed by the County Council of Gwynedd as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way shown as footpath 1 NR in the Community of Beddgelert running from Buarthau past Berth-lwyd to the County Road, a distance of approximately 700 metres to a line running from Buarthau over the bridge leading to Buarthau and on to the County Road, a distance of approximately 90 metres.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Post Office, Beddgelert and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m., Mondays to Fridays.

Any representation or objection to the Order may be sent in writing to the County Secretary (Ref.: IWT), County Offices, Shirehall Street, Caernarfon, not later than 16th July 1979 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn the County Council of Gwynedd may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for Wales, for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

## SCHEDULE

*Part I. Description of Site of Existing Path*

That part of the Footpath in the Parish of Silchester in the Borough of Basingstoke and Deane shown on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way prepared under Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 as Footpath No. 13 which commences at a junction with Road U252 and runs east-north-eastwards for 216 metres then generally east-south-eastwards for 424 metres then north-eastwards for 332 metres.

*Part II. Description of Site of Alternative Highway*

A 1.8 metres wide and grass headland path which commences at a stile at the western end of the path described in Part I of this Schedule running south-eastwards for 14 metres then south-south-eastwards for 76 metres then east-north-eastwards for 228 metres then north-eastwards for 18 metres then east-south-eastwards for 276 metres then south-eastwards for 212 metres then continuing along a 1.2 metre earth path north-eastwards for 486 metres to a bridge then continuing for 30 metres. A total distance of 1340 metres.
