2. The general effect of the Order would be further to amend the Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1979, so that:

(a) in the lengths of streets specified in the Schedule to this notice and in the first 18·29 metres of adjacent Roman Way:

(i) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive;

(ii) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place would be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive;

(iii) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle would be prohibited, except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Enfield Borough Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;

(iv) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising, would be prohibited;

(b) any existing prohibitions on waiting by vehicles, on the sale of goods and on advertising activities in the lengths of streets referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above and the service roads fronting Nos. 207 to 239 Fore Street and "The Goat" public house, High Street, Ponders End imposed by the Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1979 would be revoked.

3. The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2 (a) (i) and (ii) above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g., the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" would apply.

4. The Enfield (Restriction of Traffic) (No. 1) Traffic Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council on 11th June 1979 made the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The general effect of the Order will be to:

(a) revoke the one-way working for vehicular traffic in Little Park Gardens between its western-most junction with Church Street, Enfield and a point opposite the north-eastern limit of the proposed bus stand in Little Park Gardens, imposed by the Enfield (Prescribed Routes) (No. 5) Traffic Order 1969;

(b) prohibit vehicular traffic from entering:

(i) Little Park Gardens at its western-most junction with Church Street, Enfield;

(ii) the carriageway constructed between the island sites situated at the junction of Cecil Road and Church Street, Enfield.

3. The prohibitions referred to:

(a) in paragraph 2(b)(i) above will not apply in relation to:

(i) a stage carriage, a scheduled express carriage, a school bus or a works bus;

(ii) any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes in an emergency;

(b) in paragraph 2(b)(ii) above will not apply in relation to:

(i) a stage carriage, a scheduled express carriage, a school bus or a works bus proceeding in a northerly direction;

(ii) any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes in an emergency proceeding in a northerly direction;

(c) in paragraph 2(b) above will not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

4. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 17th June 1979, and of the above-mentioned Order of 1969 (and of the Orders which have previously amended that Order) can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made in Room B.21, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.

6. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or on the ground that any requirement of those sections of the Act or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or of any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
