

NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO VARY LICENCES TO ABSTRACT WATER FROM INLAND WATERS

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Anglian Water Authority, Great Ouse River Division by Messrs. E. M. Peck and Sons, of Rectory Farm, Great Staughton, near St. Neots, Huntingdon, Cambs, to vary proposed licence to abstract, serial No. 6/33/21/43/8 and Licence of Right serial No. 6/33/21/1/8.

The variations requested are:

1. Pending licence 6/33/21/43/8 for 18,000 gallons per hour, 432,000 gallons per day, 5,000,000 gallons October/March from the River Kym at NGR 125 644 in the parish of Great Staughton subject to a compensation flow of 153 litres/sec, at Meagre Gauging Station by way of provision of second point of abstraction on a farm ditch at approximate NGR TL 120 638 in the same parish subject to a compensation flow of 2.6 litres/sec, and
2. Licence of Right 6/33/21/1/8 by way of the inclusion of additional land as shown on the plan on deposit.

Smoke Control Order No. 36

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Hillingdon in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on 30th January 1979, made an Order entitled the London Borough of Hillingdon Smoke Control Order No. 36, declaring the area, described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemption provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will come into operation on 1st November 1979 or such later date as may be determined by the Secretary of State.

Copies of the Order (and of the map referred to therein) may be inspected free of charge at the Civic Centre, Uxbridge, Middlesex, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from 21st June 1979.

It is bounded in the north by a line running eastwards from Rickmansworth Road, Northwood in the west along the centre of Green Lane to Church Road, Northwood in the east; in the east by a line running southwards along the centre of Church Road and High Street, Northwood to Pinner Road in the south; in the south and west by a line running westwards

and northwards along the centre of Pinner Road and Rickmansworth Road to the junction with Green Lane, Northwood in the north.
