

Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is that traffic will proceed in a south-westerly direction only in that section of Caerau Road, Caerau, on the southern side of the "splitting" island at its junction with Cymmer Road (A4063) from a point opposite the eastern extremity of the "splitting" island to the eastern channel of Cymmer Road (A4063).
