

Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on the western side of Prince Road, Kenfig Hill from a point 20 metres (22 yards) north of the western side of its junction with Commercial Street (B4281) northwards for a distance of 20 metres (22 yards).

Exemptions are provided in the Order for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and roadworks, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed wait for up to 2 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

The Order came into operation on 22nd June 1979 and a copy thereof and a map showing the side of the length of road to which the Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Mid Glamorgan County Council, Cathays Park, Cardiff during normal office hours until the end of 6 weeks from 22nd June 1979.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act as so amended or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks from 22nd June 1979 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Mid Glamorgan County Council (Access Road to Health Centre off Weatherall Street/Maendy Terrace, Aberdare) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that on 12th June 1979 the Mid Glamorgan County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on both sides of the unnamed access road leading from Weatherall Street and Maendy Terrace, Aberdare, westwards to the entrance to the Health Centre, a distance of approximately 26 metres (28 yards).

Exemptions are provided in the Order for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and roadworks, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed wait for up to 2 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

Lengths of Road in the Borough of Ogwr

(i) Both sides of Route A4061 at Bryncethin, from the north-eastern boundary of the Bethania Chapel, north-eastwards to the southern end of the southern abutments of the railway bridge a distance of approximately 160 metres (175 yards).

(ii) Both sides of Spencer Road (B4280), Bryncethin from its junction with Route A4061, south-eastwards to the the south-eastern end of the bridge over Nant Bryncethin, a distance of approximately 35 metres (38 yards). (541)

GWYNEDD COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of Gwynedd (Various Roads, Trearddur Bay) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Gwynedd have, on 15th June 1979, made the above Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule VI to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

When this Order comes into effect on 5th July 1979, you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. between the 15th May and 15th September in any year on:

- (i) that westerly side of Lon St. Ffraid (B4545), Trearddur Bay in the County of Gwynedd, which extends from its junction with Ravenspoint Road for a distance of 180 metres in a northerly direction;
- (ii) that southerly side of Lon Isallt Trearddur Bay in the County of Gwynedd which extends from the existing 30 m.p.h. speed limit signs for a distance of 108 metres in an easterly direction;
- (iii) that westerly side of Ravenspoint Road which extends from its junction with Lon St. Ffraid (B4545) for a distance of 183 metres in a south-westerly direction.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, loading or unloading goods, taking in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage and, where necessary, in connection with the maintenance of any roads, the supplying of gas, electricity and water and the exercise of local authority statutory powers and duties and in specified circumstances where the vehicle is a disabled person's vehicle.
