The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to extinguish a small section of Footpath No. 3 (Part), Chettle, in the County of Dorset, commencing in the vicinity of Chafins Farm at National Grid Reference 951134 and running in a north-north-westerly direction for about 23 yards and to substitute:

A path commencing at the aforesaid National Grid Reference 951134 and running in a west-north-westerly direction for about 10 yards and thence in a north-north-easterly direction for about 20 yards. That is to say, "dog-legged" to the west to skirt one corner of the site of an intended barn.
