

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way known as Footpath No. 180, Capel, which runs from Five Oak Green Road, Tudeley, generally east, south and then east to meet Sherenden Road at Bank Farm, Tudeley, in the Parish of Capel, to a line commencing 68 metres south of the existing junction with Five Oak Green Road and leading generally eastwards for 70 metres where it rejoins the route of the existing footpath.

A copy of the Order, and the map contained in it, has been deposited, and may be inspected, free of charge, at the Dower House, Pembury, or at the Town Hall, Tunbridge Wells, between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

*Yeovil District Council (Footpath Y.10/6 at Hardington Mandeville) Public Path Diversion Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 20th June 1979, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Yeovil District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of footpath Y.10/6 that runs from a point which is approximately 27 metres south-west from the entrance of Weavers Cottage and the Lane (being the south-west side of the footbridge) in a general south-westerly direction for approximately 37 metres (total length 37 metres), to a line running from a point which is approximately 27 metres south-west from the entrance of Weavers Cottage and the Lane (being the south-west side of the footbridge) in a generally south-westerly direction for approximately 35 metres and then in a southerly direction for approximately 4 metres, rejoining the existing footpath Y.10/6 (Total length 39 metres).

*City of Carlisle Public Footpath (Diversion) Order 1979*
