Notice is hereby given that on 29th May 1979, the Secretary of State for the Environment confirmed the above-named Orders.

The effect of the Orders as confirmed is to divert the following public rights of way as described hereunder.

#### *Footpath No. 30 Sittingbourne*

The diversion of a 44 metre length of footpath extending north-easterly from a point approximately 143 metres from the junction of the footpath with footpath 31, to a line running from the same point east-north-easterly for 23 metres then northerly for 27 metres to rejoin the existing footpath.

#### *Footpath No. 31 Sittingbourne*

The diversion of a 218 metre length of footpath, extending south-south-easterly from a point approximately 42 metres from the junction of the footpath with footpath No. 32, to a line running from the same point south-easterly for 70 metres then southerly, south-easterly and westerly for 332 metres to rejoin the existing footpath.

#### *Footpath No. 32 Sittingbourne*

The diversion of a 160 metre length of the footpath extending easterly from the north-eastern corner of No. 73 Peregrine Drive to a line running from the same point south-easterly and north-easterly generally for 174 metres to rejoin the existing footpath.

The diversions referred to above will be along footways forming part of the Chilton Manor Farm Housing Development to be undertaken by Royco Homes Ltd.

Copies of the confirmed Orders and the maps contained in them have been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Central Avenue, Sittingbourne between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.
