

WEST GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

West Glamorgan County Council (St. Mary's Church Area, Port Talbot) (Prohibition of Cycling) and (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that on 25th June 1979 the West Glamorgan County Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 the effect of which is to prohibit cycling on the lengths of footpaths specified in Schedule 1 below and to prohibit waiting at any time on the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2 below.

This Order will provide for the usual exemptions for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, essential services, etc., where appropriate.

The Order will come into operation on 23rd July 1979 and may be cited as the "West Glamorgan County Council (St. Mary's Church Area, Port Talbot) (Prohibition of Cycling) and (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1979."

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the date of this notice apply to the High Court for this purpose.

SCHEDULE 1

Prohibition of Cycling on Public Footpaths

From the north-east corner of St. Joseph's Church under the Port Talbot Inner Relief Road in a north-easterly direction to the southern corner of St. Mary's Church a distance of 45 metres approximately.

From the southern corner of St. Mary's Church for a distance of 50 metres in a north-westerly direction alongside the south-west boundary of the Church.

From the northern corner of St. Mary's Church under the main railway line and the Port Talbot Inner Relief Road to Llewellyn Street a distance of 85 metres approximately in a north-east and north-westerly direction.

From the eastern corner of St. Mary's Church alongside the Church and the main railway line in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 65 metres approximately.

From the eastern corner of St. Mary's Church under the main railway line to the entrance of the Aberafan Centre—a distance of 65 metres in a north-easterly and south-westerly direction.

SCHEDULE 2

No Waiting Any Time

St. Mary's Church Car Park Access Road, both sides

From the end of the existing "Clear Way Order" on the joint bus station and car park access road in a north-easterly, north-westerly and south-westerly direction for a distance of 100 metres approximately.

St. Mary's Church Car Park Access Road, north side

A continuation of the above Order for a distance of a further 30 metres approximately in a south-westerly direction.

West Glamorgan County Council (Commercial Road, Resolven) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 25th June 1979 the West Glamorgan County Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. from Monday to Saturday inclusive on the undermentioned length of Commercial Road:

South and west side:

From a point in line with the southern side of the access lane to the former Resolven Station to a point in line with the northern side of the access lane to the rear of

the Commercial Road shops, a distance of approximately 68 metres.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order for essential services, loading and unloading facilities and disabled drivers' vehicles.

The Order will come into operation on 23rd July 1979 and may be cited as the "West Glamorgan County Council (Commercial Road, Resolven) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1979."

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the date of this Notice apply to the High Court for this purpose.

GREAT YARMOUTH BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Great Yarmouth Borough Council Off Street Parking Places (Regulation of Use) (Amendment No. 2) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that the Great Yarmouth Borough Council made an Order on 8th June 1979 under section 31 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, to control the use of the parking places named in the Schedule to this notice. The Order will come into effect on 29th June 1979.

The Order makes provision for the increase to £5 of the excess charge, which is the charge payable for a vehicle in respect of which the current parking fee specified in the Off Street Parking Places (Regulation of Use) Order 1975 and the Off Street Parking Places (Regulation of Use) (Amendment) Order 1977 has not been paid.

The Order also makes provision for the sale of season tickets for use on the parking places named in the Schedule hereto as follows:

- (a) a season ticket for use for any number of hours in any period of 24 hours from Monday to Friday inclusive at the cost of £5 for every full calendar month;
- (b) a season ticket for use for any number of hours in any period of 24 hours for 7 days in any week at the cost of £6 for every full calendar month.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 8th June 1979 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
