

for the Environment the above Direction in accordance with the provisions paragraph (3) (b) of Article 4 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1977. The Direction will remain in force for 6 months and shall then expire unless it has in the meantime been approved by the Secretary of State.

Under the terms of the General Development Order certain classes of development are regarded as "permitted development", i.e. do not require express planning consent. The effect of the newly made Direction is to require planning consent to be obtained before any development within Class II of the First Schedule of the said General Development Order 1977 is carried out within a specified area. Class II includes the erection, construction, maintenance, improvement, or other alteration of any gates, fences, walls or other means of enclosure, and the formation, laying out and construction of a means of access to a highway.

The land covered by the Direction is bordered to the north by Cock Lane and Martins Green, and to the west by the boundary of the Borough, at Hoddesdon.

Copies of the Direction, which includes a map showing its precise extent, can be seen between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on weekdays at:

The Borough of Chelmsford (Footpath 2) (Chelmsford) Public Path Diversion Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed by the Chelmsford Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way described in Part I of the Schedule hereto to a line running as described in Part II of the Schedule hereto.

A copy of the Order and of the map contained in it has been deposited at the Secretary's Department, Civic Centre, Chelmsford, Essex, and may be inspected during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Chelmsford Borough Council, Civic Centre, Chelmsford, not later than 30th July 1979 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

SCHEDULE

Part I

Footpath 2. From its commencement on Footpath 4 (hereinafter called point A) for approximately 135 metres in a south-south-westerly direction to the northern footway of Oliver Way at a point hereinafter called point B.

Part II

Footpath 2. From a point approximately 25 metres east of point A along the western footway of Sowerberry Close for approximately 100 metres in a generally south-south-easterly direction, then for approximately 70 metres in a south-westerly direction along the northern footway of Quilp Drive, then for approximately 45 metres in a west-north-westerly direction along the northern footway of Oliver Way to point B. DACORUM DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Designation of Conservation Areas at Chenies and Latimer

Notice is hereby given that with effect from 21st June 1979 the Dacorum District Council have

- (1) designated a Conservation Area at Chenies to include Mill Farm, other buildings in the group and the River Chess.

The area is defined on drawing No. 123.

- (2) designated a Conservation Area at Latimer centred on Home Farm and its outbuildings.

The area is defined on drawing No. 124.

These areas form extensions of the existing conservation areas designated by Chiltern District Council.

Copies of drawings No. 123 and No. 124 may be inspected at the office of the Director of Technical Services, Civic Centre, Hemel Hempstead.

The effect of the designation of a Conservation Area is to enable the local planning authority to exercise greater control over building and other operations and changes of use in relation to land and buildings in the area, with a view to preserving and enhancing its character and appearance.

Listed building control now applies to all buildings in conservation areas with the exception of categories of buildings specified by the Secretary of State. Anyone wishing to demolish a building within a conservation area must apply for listed building consent on the local planning authority.

Designation of a conservation area also gives control over the preservation of trees. Anyone having in mind to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy any tree in a conservation area is to give the District Council 6 weeks' notice of intention. The purpose of this provision is to give the local planning authority a final opportunity to make a tree preservation Order where appropriate before the work proposed is carried out.

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT—SECTION 210

Doncaster Borough Council, Tickhill No. 8, Public Path Diversion Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 25th May 1979 the Secretary of State for the Environment confirmed with modification the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to:

- (i) Divert the section of Public Footpath No. 8, Tickhill, Doncaster in the County of South Yorkshire shown by a bold black line running between points marked A and B on the map annexed to the Order. The section to be diverted commences at point A at the western end of The Paddock (off Alderson Drive), Tickhill and runs in a north-north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 33 metres to point B on the boundary of the Recreation Ground at Tickhill, and
- (ii) Re-route the section of footpath referred to in (i) above along the route shown by a bold black dashed line running between the points marked A—C—D—B on the map annexed to the Order. The new route commences at point A and runs in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 14 metres to point C, it then runs in a north-north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 36 metres to point D and then in a west-south-westerly direction for a distance of 12 metres to point B. The total distance between points A—C—D—B is 62 metres and the average width of the used section of footpath is 3 metres.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge in the offices of the Director of Legal and Administrative Services, Fourth Floor, Danum House, St. Sepulchre Gate, Doncaster, between 8.45 a.m. and 4.45 p.m. Monday to Friday.

This Order becomes operative as from the date from which the Council certify that the new route for the footpath has been completed to the satisfaction of the Council but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity
