

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert:

- (1) That part of the public right of way (being Footpath No. 33, Felixstowe) running from a point in O.S. 7308 in an east-north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 25 metres to its junction with Footpath No. 31, Felixstowe at the west of Nos. 5-8 Pond Close to a new route commencing at the said point in O.S. 7308 and running in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 30 metres to rejoin Footpath No. 33 Felixstowe where the latter crosses the northern boundary of O.S. 7308.
- (2) That part of the public right of way (being Footpath No. 31 Felixstowe) running from a point in O.S. 7308 to the west of Nos. 1-4 Pond Close in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 150 metres to a new route commencing at the said point in O.S. 7308 and running in a generally south-easterly direction through O.S. 8000 to rejoin the existing route of footpath No. 31 in O.S. 7308 some 70 metres west of its junction with Grange Road.
- (3) That part of the public right of way (being Footpath No. 31 Felixstowe) running from the said point in O.S. 7308 some 70 metres west of its junction with Grange Road in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 30 metres to a new route from the said point in O.S. 7308 and running in an easterly and then southerly direction for a total distance of approximately 35 metres to rejoin the existing route of Footpath No. 31, Felixstowe some 30 metres west of its junction with Grange Road.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
