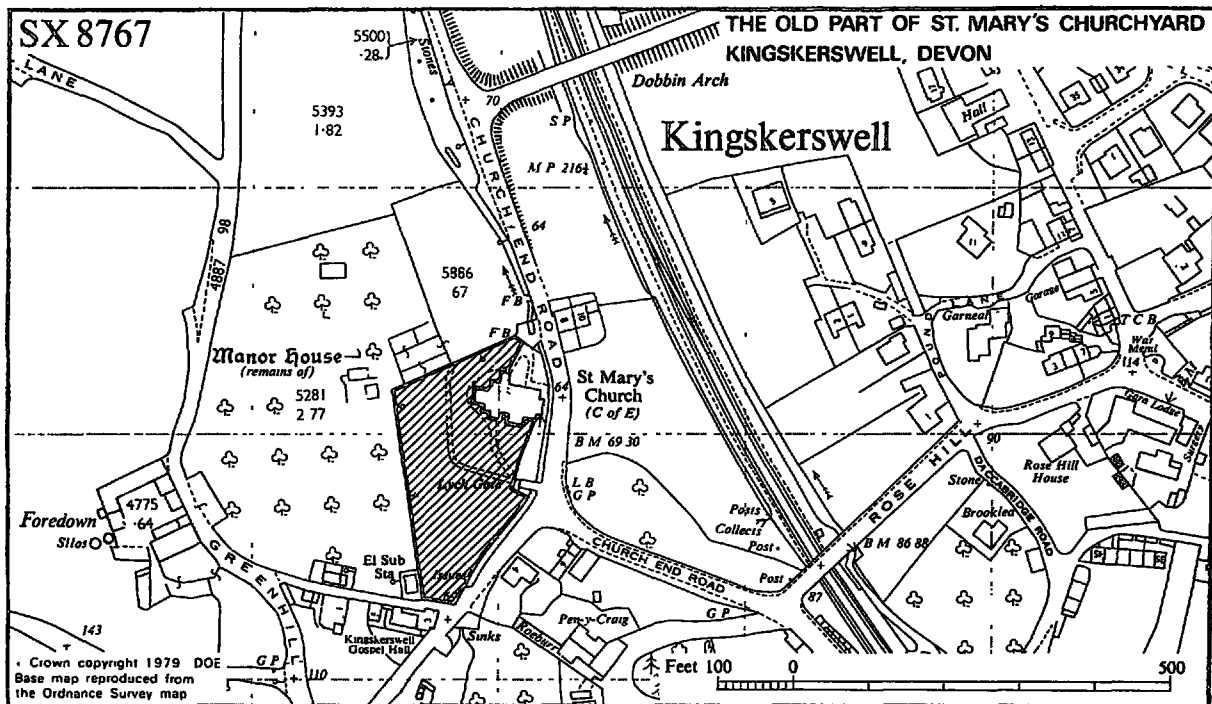

## ROYAL WARRANT OF PRECEDENCE

Whitehall, London S.W.1.  
4th June 1979

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Ann Rosemary Hope Newman widow of Sir Ralph Alured Newman, Baronet, Stella Hope Robinson wife of Neville Whiteoak Robinson, Gentleman and Lorna Margaret Dorothy Hanley wife of Sir Michael Bowen Hanley, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath shall henceforth respectively have, hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as the sisters of a Baron which would have been due to them had their father the Honourable Claude Hope Hope-Morley survived his brother Geoffrey Hope, Baron Hollenden who died on 19th October 1977, and thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Baron Hollenden.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Accountant's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England on Friday 13th July 1979 at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £300,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday 16th July 1979 to Friday 20th July 1979 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

8. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
