The Queen has been graciously pleased, on the advice of Her Majesty's Australian Ministers, to give orders for the following appointment to the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire:

Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 16th day of July 1979 to delegate to the six Counsellors of State therein named or any two or more of them full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval for anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Secretary of State for the Environment after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of St. James, Shilbottel, in the County of Northumberland, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that burials should be discontinued forthwith in the Churchyard of St. James,

Shilbottle, in the said Parish, shown hatched on the plan

annexed hereto.

Provided that in any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons hereto the condition that no part of the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the

less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and His Royal Highness The Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf give Notice of such Representation and order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 12th day of September next.

And do further direct that this Order be forthwith pub-

And do further direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Church or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 12th day of

September.
