The Warwickshire County Council (Footpath AE. 138 Ansley) Public Path Diversion Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 23rd October 1979 the Warwickshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed is to divert that part of footpath AE. 138 which runs through the Croft Mead residential site off Birmingham Road, Ansley, to a line following estate footpaths/footways on the site to form a continuous route. The diversion is necessary to enable residential development to be undertaken by the North Warwickshire Borough Council.

A copy of the Order, as confirmed, and of the map contained in it may be inspected free of charge at the Office of the County Secretary, Shire Hall, Warwick on Mondays to Fridays inclusive during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the date on which it is certified by the Council that the alternative highway has been created to their satisfaction but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order the person may under section 244 of the Act within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application for the purpose to the High Court.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDERS

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 210

*(a) The County of Wiltshire (Footpath No. 43, Lydiard Tregoze) Public Path Diversion Order 1979**(b) The County of Wiltshire (Footpaths Nos. 47 and 48, Lydiard Tregoze) Public Path Diversion Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Orders (hereinafter referred to as "the Orders") made on 25th October 1979 are about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Wiltshire County Council as unopposed Orders.

The effect of the Orders, if confirmed without modification, will be:

(a) to divert the length of Footpath 43, Lydiard Tregoze where it crosses Area 1A and 1B Westlea Down mostly on to estate roads and footways, but at the north-western end a separate length of footpath is to be provided and at the south-eastern end a footpath link will be provided through an area to be reserved for public open space; and

(b) to divert lengths of Footpaths Nos. 47 and 48 Lydiard Tregoze where they cross the proposed industrial estate at Westlea Down on Area 3C and 3D situated between the main grid road to the east of Shaw Road and the disused railway line at the Thamesdown Borough boundary on to a new line to be provided by way of a subway under the grid road, a combined footpath and cycle path alongside the grid road, thence along a new industrial road with footpaths to the disused railway line, and by a new footpath along the disused railway line.

Copies of the Orders and the maps contained in them have been deposited at the County Solicitor and Clerk's Office, Environment Division, County Hall, Trowbridge, at the offices of the North Wiltshire District Council at Monkton Park, Chippenham, and at the Sub-Office at Manor House, Wootton Bassett, and at the offices of the Chief Executive Group, Thamesdown Borough Council, Civic Offices, Swindon, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to either of the Orders may be sent in writing to the County Solicitor and Clerk (Reference RNB/ENV/PC.155(2)) at County Hall, Trowbridge, not later than 30th November 1979, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

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If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Wiltshire County Council may, instead of submitting either of the Orders to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If either of the Orders are submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
