HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The London - Fishguard Trunk Road (Southleys to Corner Piece Improvement) Order 1979 and The London - Fishguard Trunk Road (Southleys to Corner Piece Improvement Side Roads) Order 1979.

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that in relation to the above-mentioned Trunk Road at Rudbaxton in the County of Dyfed, he has made under the Highways Act 1959:

1. an Order under section 7 which provides that a road which he proposes to construct at Rudbaxton in the County of Dyfed shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation;

2. an Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising him

- to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter the C3155 road to Rudbaxton,
- to stop up highways,
- to construct a new highway to connect the C3155 road to Rudbaxton (as improved) with the new trunk road,
- to stop up private means of access to premises, and
- to provide new means of access to premises

all at Rudbaxton aforesaid and to provide the transfer of the said new highway to the County Council of Dyfed as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The Chester - Bangor Trunk Road (Holywell By-Pass and Slip Roads) Order 19 and The Chester - Bangor Trunk Road (Holywell By-Pass and Slip Roads Side Roads) Order 19 .

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:—

1. an Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959 providing:

(a) that a road about 9.35 kilometres in length which he proposes to construct at Holywell in the County of Clwyd shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation; and

(b) that the length of the Chester - Bangor Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Clwyd (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new trunk road is open for through traffic; and

2. an Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising him—

- to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
- to stop up highways;
- to construct new highways;
- to stop up private means of access to premises; and
- to provide new means of access to premises

all at Holywell aforesaid, and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Clwyd as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.

The Trunk Road (Western Avenue) (Prohibition of U-Turn) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968. The effect of the Order is that no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle proceeding in either direction along the length of trunk road specified in the Schedule to this Notice to make a "U" turn so as to proceed in the opposite direction.
