###### *The London—Penzance Trunk Road (Bullington Cross Side Roads) Order 1979*

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that, in relation to the above mentioned Trunk Road at Bullington Cross in the County of Hampshire, he has made under Section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 an Order, the effect of which is:-

(a) to authorise him:-

- (i) to stop up highways,
- (ii) to construct a new footpath,
- (iii) to stop up a private means of access to premises, and
- (iv) to provide new means of access to premises, all at Bullington Cross aforesaid on or in the vicinity of the route of the above mentioned new trunk road; and

(b) to provide for the transfer of the said new highway to the County Council of Hampshire as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highway has been completed and is open for pedestrian use.

###### *The Winchester—Preston Trunk Road (Sutton Scotney By-Pass and South Wonston Diversion Side Roads) Order 1979*

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that, in relation to the new trunk road to be constructed by him as a by-pass to Sutton Scotney and South Wonston in the County of Hampshire, he has made under Section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 an Order, the effect of which is:-

(a) to authorise him:-

- (i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
- (ii) to stop up highways,
- (iii) to construct new highways,
- (iv) to stop up private means of access to premises,
- (v) to provide new means of access to premises, all on or in the vicinity of the route of the above mentioned new trunk road; and

(b) to provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Hampshire as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.
