Notice of the Designation of a Conservation Area at Ilkeston Derbyshire

Notice is hereby given of the designation of a conservation area in Ilkeston, Derbyshire.

Attention is drawn to the effect of the designation on the demolition of buildings situated within the area where in most cases to consent of the Local Planning Authority is now required.

Centred on the Market Place the area extends westwards to include the Town Hall, part of the Ilkeston Co-operative Society's shop, the Police Station, the United Reform Church and residential properties on either side of Wharnccliffe Road to its junction with West End Drive including West End House. Returning back towards the Market Place the area includes the County Court, the Scala Cinema and part of the public car park. The service reservoir is excluded. Properties fronting the Market Place and St. Mary Street to its junction with Burns Street are included along with 1 Gregory Street and Malin House. Including the southern part of the Club Row car park the boundary follows a line northwards to include all the properties fronting Bath Street from Nos. 1-47 inclusive and then returns on the opposite side of the road (excluding the properties on that side) to a point adjacent to 22 Bath Street. Properties numbered 2-20 Bath Street (inclusive) and 4, 5, 9, 10, 11 and 50 East Street are included as are Anchor Row, the Lower Market Place, St. Mary's Church, the Vicarage and St. George's House. Parts of High Street, including the Kingdom Hall, Nos. 4 and 5 High Street and Orchard House, together with the fields numbered 7174, 7178, 7479, 7677 and 7882 (part) form the eastern boundary of the conservation area. The churchyard and the former St. Mary's Church School off Hallcroft Road are included, together with Nos. 1, 2, 7-14 Market Street (inclusive), 21 Gladstone Street and the Rutland Garments factory. The library, Post Office, Ritz Cinema, Coronation Street are included with Weaver Row forming the southern boundary at this point. Crossing South Street the boundary follows Queen Street to its junction with Albert Street, and returns to the rear of the Ilkeston Co-operation Society premises and includes the Baptist Church, Nos. 1-3 Queen Street (inclusive) and 16-26 South Street (inclusive).

A copy of the plan showing the boundary of the Conservation Area may be viewed at The Hall, Derby Road, Long Eaton, or the Town Hall, Market Place, Ilkeston, Monday to Thursday (9 a.m. - 5 p.m.) and Friday (9 am-4.30 pm).

The Borough Council of South Ribble (Footpath No. 24 (Part of) Longton) Public Path Diversion Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 27th November 1979 the South Ribble Borough Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to stop up that part of footpath number 24 which runs from the junction of the footpath with Briar Croft in a southerly direction for 28 metres approximately and then in a south-easterly direction for 20 metres approximately.

The alternative route is a line running from the junction of the footpath with Briar Croft in a south-easterly direction along Briar Croft for a distance of 20 metres approximately, then in a southerly direction for a distance of 40 metres approximately, then in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 10 metres approximately.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Civic Centre, West Paddock, Leyland, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays.

The Order became operative as from 27th November 1979, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he may within 6 weeks from 17th December 1979, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.—Dated 27th November 1979.
