NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

*East Hampshire District Council (Parish of Clanfield
Part of Footpath No. 21) Diversion Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the above named Order was made on 26th November 1979 and is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the East Hampshire District Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert Clanfield Footpath No. 21 from its present junction with Footpath No. 18 to a junction thirty metres approximately north-east of its present junction with Footpath No. 18 so that the footpath runs along the headland of the pasture adjoining Windmill Hill Farm instead of diagonally across it.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Offices of the East Hampshire District Council, Penns Place, Durford Road, Petersfield, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to have sent to you in due course a notice to the effect that the Order has been confirmed and a copy of the Order as confirmed you should write to the East Hampshire District Council at the above address giving your name and the address to which those documents may be sent.

Compensation for depreciation or damage in consequence of the coming into operation of the Order is payable in accordance with Section 31 and 113(2) of the 1959 Act to which reference should be made.

Any representation or objection in respect of the Order should be sent in writing to the District Secretary, East Hampshire District Council, Penns Place, Durford Road, Petersfield before Tuesday 14th January 1980 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn the East Hampshire District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment themselves confirm the Order if the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be submitted with the Order.—Dated 10th December 1979.

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ROCHDALE BOROUGH COUNCIL

Highways Act 1959 Section 108 Twelfth Schedule
