#### SOUTHERN RHODESIA

*The Southern Rhodesia Constitution (Interim Provisions) Order 1979*

(S.I. 1979/No. 1571)

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 1 (2) of the Southern Rhodesia Constitution (Interim Provisions) Order 1979, I hereby appoint the 12th December 1979 as the day on which sections 2, 4, 5, 6 and 7 of the said Order shall come into operation.

*Town and Country Planning Act 1971*

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has, on the application of the Neath Borough Council, made an Order under section 212 of the Town and Country

Planning Act 1971 to extinguish any rights which persons may have to use vehicles on the highway specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

The Order contains provisions for permitting the use of the highway by vehicles being used:—

- (a) for Police, Ambulance or Fire Brigade purposes;
- (b) on behalf of a statutory undertaker or the Post Office and engaged upon the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal or removal of any sewer or any main, pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity, or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878 under, in, on, over, along or across the highway or any land adjacent to the highway.
- (c) in accordance with a special authorisation for that use given by or on behalf of the West Glamorgan County Council, the Neath Borough Council or the Chief Officer of Police for that area.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL (quoting reference number WR15/83/3 and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Neath Borough Council, Civic Centre, Neath.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the 13th December 1979 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

Any person who, at the time of the coming into force of the Order, has an interest in land having lawful access to the highway to which the Order relates shall be entitled to be compensated by the Neath Borough Council as the local planning authority in respect of any depreciation in the value of his interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable.

#### SCHEDULE

*Description of highway to which this Notice relates*

The highway is situated at Neath in the County of West Glamorgan and is that length of Water Street which extends from its junction with the southern side of Wind Street in a south-easterly direction to its junction with the northern side of Fairfield Way.
